PARK IMPROVEMENTS

Several park improvements have been made at the Park this year with some presently completed. A new 8 foot fence has been installed around the swimming pool replacing the original 1984 fence. New sidewalks to the east and west pool gate have also been added. The swimming pool bathroom has had a metal roof added replacing the original shingle roof. In League Stadium, control panels will be replaced on the existing ball field light towers. A large surface area of the Hardball Cafe area has had 30 yards of concrete added. A new playground area for 2-12 year olds will be added southwest of the basketball courts. Six pieces of equipment will be added in June of this year. At Southside Park, two new bridges will be installed accessing two new additions at the Park. In the southeast corner of the park, a practice ball field will be constructed this summer. On the southwest corner, a one acre dog park will be added. The dog park will be completed later this year.

HUNTINGBURG LEAGUE STADIUM

Huntingburg League Stadium is a unique baseball stadium with a seating capacity of 2,783. The original ball field and grandstand were renovated and expanded in 1991 by Columbia Pictures for filming of the movie "A League of Their Own", which starred Tom Hanks, Geena Davis, Rosie O'Donnell, Madonna and was directed by Penny Marshall.

In the Fall of 1995 a H.B.O. movie "Soul of the Game" was filmed at the Stadium. Stars included Del Roy Lindo, Mikelti Williams, Blair Underwood and R. Lee Erney.

During the spring months, the baseball field is home to the Southridge Raiders and the field also hosts the I.H.S.A.A. Semi-State in June of this year.

DUBOIS COUNTY BOMBERS

The Dubois County Bombers are the newest baseball franchise in the Central Illinois Collegiate League, which consists of eight teams. The Wooden Bat Collegiate League is one of eight in the country and gets partial funding from Major League Baseball. The league was founded in 1963 and has 153 alumni in the Major Leagues. The Bombers relocated here from Alton, Illinois, where they were 2004 CILC Champions. All home games will be played at Huntingburg League Stadium.


SENIOR CITIZENS CENTER



PARKS

The Huntingburg Parks and Recreation Department consists of two (2) parks. **HUNTINGBURG CITY PARK** is located at First and Cherry Streets. It is a 40 acre park with facilities for all age groups. Facilities include the following:

- **A 50 meter municipal swimming pool, including a water slide, large deck area, wading pool, and bath house with a concession stand.
- **Extensive picnic areas with four shelter houses, 96 picnic tables, 10 grills, 9 benches, and playground equipment for all ages.
- **A lighted little league baseball field.
- **League Stadium, a 3,000 seat lighted professional baseball field.
- **Softball fields, including a lighted girls' softball field, and a lighted men's softball field.
- **Two lighted tennis courts.
- **Two lighted volleyball courts.
- **Two basketball courts with lights.
- **Three lighted horseshoe pits.
- **A lighted walking trail with a paved surface that winds throughout the city park. The trail is one and one-half miles long.

SOUTHSIDE PARK is located on South Park Drive and is a 12-acre Park established in 1979. Facilities at this site include:

- **Picnic area with 14 tables and 2 grills.
- **One shelter house with 6 large tables.
- **Large Playground
- **One flush toilet building
- **Two horseshoe pits
- **One basketball goal
- **One lighted Pony League baseball field, concession stand, and restrooms
- **Two parking areas accommodating 65 vehicles

FUTURE PARK DEVELOPMENT

A new park is being planned for the old landfill property on West Sixth Street. A master plan was developed in 2002 for this property through a Community Planning Fund Grant in the amount of \$10,000.00.

In May of this year, the Park Department applied for a Recreational Trail Program Grant at the property for a 1.1 mile paved trail throughout the 43 acre property. The grant would provide \$150,000.00 to the project for the trails. A golf driving range is also planned for the property. The range should be available in the spring 2007.

SHELTERHOUSE RESERVATIONS

Reservations are accepted for four park shelters at the City Park, the Main Shelter, East Shelter, Southeast Shelter and the Southwest Shelter. The small shelter at the Southside Park can also be reserved. Reservations can be made by contacting the City Hall at 508 E. 4th Street, Huntingburg, IN or by calling (812) 683-2211.

SHELTERHOUSE RULES

1. Shelters can be reserved effective January 2nd of each year.
2. Shelters must be reserved seven (7) days prior to the reservation date.
Reservations will not be confirmed until payment has been received.
3. Large shelter—\$40.00 deposit with a \$20.00 refund if receipt is returned within 30 days of the reserved date and after clean-up of the shelter has been verified.
4. East shelter, Southeast Shelter, Southwest Shelter and Southside Park Shelter -

\$20.00 deposit with a \$10.00 refund if receipt is returned within 30 days of the reserved date and after clean-up of the shelter has been verified.

5. The Parks Department will post a sign with the name of the reserving group.
6. Groups using the facility will be allowed to use the shelter from 10:00 am until 11 :00 pm.
7. Large tables are not to be removed from the facility.
8. Trash containers will not be provided. Park users will be responsible for removing all trash and refuse from the premises after the completion of the outing.

PARK RULES

1. Enforced speed limit of 15 MPH in the parks.
2. All motorized vehicles, cars, trucks, motorcycles, four-wheelers, mopeds, etc. are not permitted on grass areas.
3. All animals in the parks must be on a leash.
4. Vandalism on park premises will not be tolerated.
5. Littering is strictly prohibited on park premises and shall be subject to fines.
6. Household trash deposited at the parks is prohibited.
7. The use of obscene language and public intoxication on park premises is prohibited.
8. Roller blades, roller skates, in-line skates, skateboards, or any type of coasters is allowed only on parking lots and walking trails.

VIOLATORS WILL BE PROSECUTED FEES

City of Huntingburg residents, through City property taxes, make a significant financial contribution to the operation of the Parks system. Non-resident fees are charged to apportion an equalizing fee to non-resident participants so that they can contribute to the overall financing of the Parks system on an equitable basis with City residents. Fees are listed separately for Huntingburg residents and out of City residents for some programs. Verification of residence status may be requested.

SWIMMING LESSONS

Swimming lessons will be offered in the morning and evening hours throughout the summer for pre-school ages, tiny tots, school age and adults. The cost of the lessons is \$25.00 per session, per person, for city residents. Non-residents will be charged \$30.00 per session for each individual. Sign-ups for the lessons will be May 27-June 5. Morning lessons will be offered in 4 sessions, Monday through Friday, for 2 weeks each:

- I. June 5 through June 16
- II. June 19 through June 30
- III. July 3 through July 14
- IV. July 17 through July 28

Evening lessons will be offered in two sessions, Monday and Wednesday for 5 weeks each:

- I. June 5 through July 7
- II. July 10 through August 11

DAILY ADMISSION

General admission is \$3.00 per person. Children 4 and under are free.

COUPON BOOKS

A Coupon booklet contains 20 coupons and the cost is \$40.00. Coupon booklets left over from the 2005 season will be honored during the 2006 swim season. Coupon booklets may be purchased at the City Pool.

POOL RENTAL

The Huntingburg City Pool is available for rental to individuals, churches, clubs, and groups. The pool may be rented on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday evenings. The charge is \$50.00 per hour and/or \$2.00 per person, whichever is higher for a 2-hour party. A non-refundable deposit of \$25.00 is required to reserve a date.
